We had an amazing day on the Wednesday in our Sports4Schools event and we had a really inspiring assembly from Rich Parker, where he shared his values of aiming high, having a go and believing in yourself. Rich was so impressed with how everybody in the school supported each other during their circuits. He said we were the best school he had been to! Thank you to everyone for supporting us and their very generous donations.

We have started to receive Easter bonnets and Easter Gardens in the Hall, please ensure that they are all in for 30th of March. We will have our final collection of food for the foodbank this week and are so grateful for the donations we have had so far. It has been a great way to support a local charity during the Lent period.

Well the highlight of our week has to be our trip to Foxdown Children's Farm yesterday. In the morning the children helped to feed the animals. As they went round the farm, Shelly was telling them all about the animals, what they like to eat, how they are looked after and what the female and males were called. They met the donkeys, the goats, the ponies, the pigs, the ducks, the sheep, the calf, the rabbits and the guinea pigs. They met all the baby animals and the children remembered their names. After feeding the animals they played with the toys in the barn for a break before lunch. In the afternoon, Shelly gave them a talk on guinea pigs and rabbits. We split into three groups, taking turns to pet the guinea pigs and rabbits, participate in an Easter egg hunt and play with the farm toys. Their highlight of the day was watching a goat give birth to a kid. What a wonderful day!

In Woodpeckers this week they have been planning and writing their own traditional tales using wordless books. They children have been aiming high to include noun phrases and exclamation sentences. In maths they have all started measurement: the year 1's are looking at weight and volume and the year 2's are looking at times on an analogue clock.

In Owls, the children have all been aiming high whilst completing some end of term quizzes. The children are still showing great focus to complete their work in all subjects, especially geography, English and computing. The children are able to recall more information about the subjects they have been learning. Please continue to ask them about their learning.

In science, Kestrel class learnt about air resistance and water resistance. They enjoyed dropping paper onto the floor and balls of playdough into water to see the effects for themselves! They have been practising hard and working to remember their gymnastics routine ready for our visit, next Wednesday, to Colyton to perform it.

Joined by three children from Kestrels, this week in Eagle class they were so incredibly lucky to be invited to a piano concert at Seaton Gateway Theatre. The performance was piano duets, which were played on a grand piano. The children really enjoyed themselves and were superb at taking part and guessing the fairy tales and sounds that were being played.
