## Online over the summer

We are aware that very young children are now accessing on line platforms. A reminder that there are so many positives about the online world but children do need support and guidance as well as close monitoring to ensure that they are safe. Some of our very youngest children are talking to each other about characters that suggest that they (or perhaps older siblings) are accessing material that is not age appropriate. This includes forums such as Poppy Playground. You may want to do your own research rather than asking your children about this as it could peak their interest if they do not know about it.

Essentially there are games that seem as though they are for children but they are not.

As always it is sensible to be alert to the internet trends in order to try to stay one step ahead of the children and young people.

We have been alerted to a game called Poppy Playground which has a character called Huggy Wuggy. Both the name of the game and the character sound friendly and cute. They are not.

This character hugs and whispers unkind and menacing comments and ideas to the person they are hugging.

This game and this character engages and influences children.

This is an online game. There are also related videos on YouTube. Due to the child friendly name these are not being filtered. The game itself does not have age restrictions but the developers have set the appropriate age at 8+

The game does have to be purchased as a download but there are many free downloads and videos which are accessible on a range of platforms including YouTube for kids.

This is the summary of the game:

Poppy Playtime is a horror/puzzle game which involves the player investigating an abandoned toy factory to solve the mystery of what happened.

The toys in the stories are chased by Huggy Wuggy. The game creates a sense of danger and tension, with images of toys covered in blood.

It has become popular amongst 5 to 7 year olds. Many do not appreciate that they are watching something that is scaring them.

Please check that your child is not accessing this game as it is causing anxiety and nightmares as well as becoming a game that is translated into playground behaviours.

It is also possible that older children are accessing the game and then sharing the ideas from the game with older children.

We are not yet aware of this game being accessed by pupils at St Mary's but will remain watchful.

As always with these internet trends it is sensible to be alert and to be checking what your child is accessing.
