Dear Parents,

I hope you all had a lovely summer break and times away, despite the rather changeable weather. The teachers and I were all back on Tuesday 1 September and we had two training days looking at further developing teaching and learning and our maths teaching in particular, with the TAs joining us for both mornings.

It was lovely to welcome back all the children last Thursday. They all looked really smart and keen and eager to learn. I always love to go and visit Reception class to see our newest and youngest children on their first day. They were all busily involved in a range of activities and Mrs Burrough and her TAs (Mrs Fish and Mrs Greaves) have done a great job in getting everything ready for the start of the children's great educational adventure, as have all the other teachers.

We welcome Miss Helena West to our teaching team. She is teaching our Year 1/2 children in Woodpecker class. We hope that she has a really happy time with us as she starts her new teaching career and we wish her all the best.

On a completely different note, I have been told that a rumour is going around that our school is in Special Measures. I wanted to assure you that this is <u>not</u> the case. St Mary's is not in Special Measures. This grading can only be awarded by OfSTED following an OfSTED inspection, which we have not had. I can only presume that the rumour has started following the letter that Mark Burrough (Chair of Governors) and I sent out last term giving our SATs results and letting you know that we have an EMG (Enhanced Monitoring Group) in place.

As we explained in our letter, the teaching at St Mary's has not been good or outstanding all the time, therefore CAST (Catholic and Anglican Schools Trust), our multi Academy Trust, has put in place the EMG to provide the support the school needs to rapidly improve teaching and learning so that it is always good and outstanding. The work on this started in May and will continue for the foreseeable future because all of our children and you as parents deserve the best teaching and learning opportunities – children only get one chance at education.

If you hear people talking in these terms, please let them know what the facts are or ask them to speak to me or Mark Burrough.


Music lessons
