Fire Safety – staying safe – awareness and positive action

It is important that children are aware of the ways that we keep ourselves safe. We do this in positive ways that allow them to develop awareness and skills. We appreciate that for some children this can create questions and sometimes worries.

In the last few weeks we have been practicing the fire safety procedures with all children. Last week we told the children that the fire alarm would go off as part of a practice and that we would repeat it again this week. Children left the building promptly and quietly to ensure that we were lined up and everyone was accounted for within three minutes.

Attendance – absence request forms

These have been updated by Devon County Council. They do not make it clear what is considered to be an authorised absence. As I have explained previously, we follow Devon and National guidelines, in order to achieve a consistent response to all absence requests.

Attendance really does matter and the national guidelines protect the most vulnerable children and families in the school system. Having a policy that does not give authorised absence, except for very exceptional direct family wedding and funerals, allows schools to closely monitor attendance and to step in with support when attendance changes.

At St Mary's we notify parents at the end of the first time if absence is below 95 %, even when we know the reasons for the absence. When pupil attendance falls below 90 % we will always contact families to ensure that together we are doing all that is possible to show improvements in attendance.

We are very grateful to all families who work with us to arrive at school on time each day and to maintain high levels of attendance. If you ever have any concerns about your child's attendance then please contact the office to speak with myself or our pastoral support worker, Mrs Clist.
