Dear Parents,

Welcome to our first school newsletter of the Autumn Term.

The children have settled back into school well and are working hard in their lessons. The new Reception children are steadily building up their time in school, and will be full-time with us from next week. The classes have all completed their individual Class Charter, setting out their expectations for behaviour and learning within their class environment. These charters will then be used to link into a Whole-School Charter. The School Council will discuss their thoughts and it will be ratified in the new Choices Policy.

Friday assembly has changed format slightly, with one pupil per class being awarded a Star of the Week. A Star of the Week award is for a pupil's effort in all aspects of school life. As a leadership team we will not know who that person is until we read the certificate out in assembly, as staff within the class will choose a pupil and write the certificate.

Children are working towards Head Teacher Awards, and will be presented with the award in the Friday Celebration assembly once they have filled their Head Teacher Award sheet. Children will build up merits in order to achieve the award, and these can be given out by any member of staff in line with the Choices Policy, and to promote our culture of positive praise. Parents will be invited to attend and watch the presentation of this award.

We would like to say thank you for your support in the change to end of day collection. It looks to be working well and is helping to keep children safe.
