Newsletter - 12th May 2023

A huge well done to our year 6 children who have completed their SATs week. They have shown amazing resilience and we are all so proud of them.

Thank you to everyone who came to our celebration for the Coronation it was lovely to see so many of you there and I hope you enjoyed it as much as we did.

*In Robins this week, after reading the book The King's Pants, they designed a pair of pants that they thought King Charles III would wear if he came to visit St Mary's. They thought about what was special about their school as well as what they associated with the King. The children suggested that their school values were important and they were able to explain what they were. They also thought about what they enjoyed about school, they mentioned reading, maths, PE, music, explore and learn to name but a few. The following day, they wrote a few sentences about what they had chosen and why. In their maths they have been learning about teens numbers and using Numicon and tens frames to represent teens numbers. In RE they have been exploring the story of Pentecost.

*This week Woodpeckers have been writing their stories based on 'The Day Louis got Eaten'. They have really enjoyed using their imaginations to create their own monsters. We have really enjoyed learning about the physical features in Axminster and comparing them to the physical features in Sydney. We also had a very exciting visit from some lambs earlier in the week.

*This week, Owls have explored the different patterns they can create in the art collage. The children experimented with block, half-drop and mirror patterns. In science, the children chose what equipment was needed to measure each other's shadows. They discussed how shadows are created when they block the sun. They have continued researching about Neil Armstrong and Christopher Columbus in history, next week they will compare their lives.

*Kestrel's class enjoyed seeing a small group of lambs brought in by Miss Hooper. They found out that you can tell the age of the lambs by their teeth! In History they found out how farming was changed with the arrival of the railway and had a go at making butter.

*Year 5's in Eagle Class have been amazing this week. The have worked superbly in the hall, whilst the year 6 have been doing their SATs. They have also been thinking about the Mother Mary and getting ready for our Crowning of Mary Mass on Monday.

*Year 6, this week you have sat your SATs and we are so proud of the way that you have all risen to the challenge. You are near the end of your primary school journey and you have learnt so much more than verb tense, long multiplication and how to answer 3-mark questions.

You've learnt about the past; you've learnt the continents of the world; you've learnt how to mix colours. You've learnt how to conduct a science experiment, how to balance and even how to program!

But, beyond the skills set out in the curriculum, you've also learnt life skills - how to tie your shoelaces, to tidy up your mess - you've learnt the power of a paper towel! You've learnt how to make friends and how to keep them. You've learnt to listen, to show empathy, to care for your peers.

You've learnt about learning - that it's a journey, not a destination. You've learnt how to be role models to other children, and how to do your parents and teachers proud

SATs only tell us how you did on one day, in one area. We know so much more about you and about how amazingly special you are. A huge well done to all of you!
