Newsletter – 10th March 2023



We have seemed to have missed much of the snow that has been around this week but we have certainly felt the cold. Hopefully next week we will see a return to some slightly warmer temperatures, which always improves the playtimes.

We discovered that Rich Parker will be the athlete visiting our school on the 22nd of March to support our sponsored circuit event. Money raised goes towards the purchase of sporting equipment for the school and to support Athletes to pursue a professional pathway in their sports. For us it is important to showcase to children the range of sports that can be taken to a professional level and that scooting, skating and skateboarding fall into this category. Alongside this we continue to receive donations for the local foodbank as part of our giving for lent.

We are beginning to think about events that can be run during the summer term to raise funds to enhance the children's education. If you would like to volunteer to run or support an event, please let me know and we will put a date in the diary to discuss possible events.

This week, Robins have continued to do lots of writing based on the story, 'The Way Back Home' by Oliver Jeffers. They have been writing conversations between the two characters (the boy and the Martian) as well as writing their opinion of the events in the story. In maths they have continued to explore number bonds to ten. They will continue to work on their number bonds to ten, practically and visually so the children can commit them to memory. They have had a delivery of potatoes that have been busy, sprouting ready to be planted in the garden. They are just waiting for the weather to improve before they start planting

In Woodpeckers, they have been learning about exclamation sentences and have been trying to use them in their speech and their writing. All of the children have started their new maths units, the year 1's have started on length and height and the year 2's are looking at multiplication and division. In RE they have started looking at Lent.

In Owl class they have been writing their own versions of 'Jack and the Dream sack', the children have been shown enjoyment throughout this whole unit of writing. They are starting their new maths unit on time, please support this by asking your children to practise reading the time at different points in the day. In DT they have been looking at the food groups of dairy and sugars. Please ask your children if they can remember why dairy products are good for us

Kestrel class have found out about the different biomes in the world. They have looked at thematic maps to identify them and have begun to describe what each is like. In English they have used the laptops to research facts about an animal to use to create a page for their class book.

This week in Eagle's class they have been enjoying writing persuasively about Iceland. The children are learning all about persuasive features and how to use them. In science they have been learning about the human digestive system and this week they have learnt all about the stomach. The class will be putting on a class assembly for the whole school, so they are ensuring that they have clear diagrams and posters in order so that they can share their knowledge of the digestive system with the younger children. Please support your child by encouraging them to read and to practise their skills on IXL.

Dance


