Dear Parents,

Thank you so much to everyone who sent clothes into school for the Churches Together in Axminster collection for Samara's Aid Appeal. We had a really good response and Jeny Butler, one of our parishioners, collected all the bags to get the clothes packaged up and sent off. They will be distributed to refugees who are currently enduring freezing winters in the mountains of Lebanon and Turkey.

You will have seen recently that roofers have been into school to fix our flat roof at the front of the building. I think they picked the coldest days of the winter so far to carry out the work but we are all thankful that it has been completed, particularly with all the rain we have had recently.

It has been lovely to welcome 5 new children to our school recently. Amelia has joined Eagles class and Mia has joined Owls. Also sisters Madison, Scarlett and Isabella have joined Kestrels, Woodpeckers and Robins respectively. We welcome all of the children and hope they have a really happy time with us.

As you will have read, we have our Section 48 (Canon 806) inspection next week on Tuesday and Wednesday. We will have two inspectors from Plymouth Diocese with us for the 2 days looking at our teaching, liturgy, assemblies, prayer time, the children's RE work as well as talking to staff and children. We will receive a written report approximately 2 weeks after the inspection which will be shared with you. If you have not yet completed your parent questionnaire, please drop it into the office over the next couple of days.

#### **School Uniform**

A number of children have been coming to school recently without full and correct uniform. Could I please remind you that children should be wearing button through shirts or blouses with a school tie. Polo shirts are not part of our winter uniform.

We have also had an interesting array of socks recently. Girls should be wearing white socks or navy blue tights. Boys should be wearing dark socks – black, grey or navy. We should not be seeing any colourful or patterned socks or tights.

Finally, if children are wearing hair bands, slides, hair ties etc, these should be navy blue and should be suitable for school.
