Class News

Robins have had a great first whole week at school and have settled really well. This week we have mostly been concentrating on using the areas of the classroom, being respectful of the resources and remembering to tidy away after ourselves. In our RE this week we have been listening to the story of Creation and have learnt a Creation song. We have learnt that God made me, God loves me, God loves everyone, God is love and God loves each one of us as a unique person. Each one of us is very special. We must treat others in a caring way because God made them too. We also learnt the chorus of a song called, 'God Loves Me' by John Burland. We have painted some fabulous self-portraits, independently and have made self-portraits out of transient art resources. Well done Robins!

Welcome to a new and exciting year in Woodpecker class! We have had such a great start. The children have been getting to know one another again after the summer. Our classroom has had a few tweaks over the summer, so everyone has been exploring the environment. Our stars of the week this week were the year 2s, who have impressed us so much with their maturity and kindness towards the year 1s. They have risen to the challenge of being role models! Year 1 and year 2 will each bring home reading books tailored to their level. Please read as often as possible with your child - we recommend every day but appreciate that this can sometimes be difficult. Reading is the most important way that you can support your child academically and we really notice the progress when children are regular readers at home. Please ensure that your child has a water bottle in school and that they only bring water into school - no squash, please.

What an amazing start Owl Class have made this year! They have shown fantastic engagement in every lesson. They are enjoying our English unit of Little Red Riding Hood, they will be writing their own versions in the coming weeks. In History, we became archaeologists and paleontologists to find evidence of the past. In art, we used a variety of different techniques to paint with watercolours. Please see the website for updates.

Kestrels have had a wonderful start to their new school year. They have settled into their routines quickly and have blended very well as a new class. We had an exciting two afternoons looking at solar power and understanding how this works and visiting a solar farm to ask an engineer all of our questions. We even got to test mini solar-powered equipment in school. We have been enjoying the story of Tom Thumb and also looking at other traditional tales as well.

Eagles class have settled into work very well after the summer break. In English they have been reading a version of Rumplestiltskin retold from a different point of view. They have practised creating atmosphere in their writing, In History, they have been finding out who the Anglo Saxons were and how they settled in England. In RE we have begin to explore the story of Abraham, they have found out what life was like in Ancient Egypt when the story took place,

Kestrels had an exciting couple of day learning about solar panels. First, we had Kate from Earth Energy Education come into school to teach us about renewable energy and solar farms. On the first day we did a workshop experiencing solar power and how we could use it to replace batteries in circuits to power light bulbs, buzzers and motors. We then used tools that an electrician would use to test how much electricity was being powered using different amounts of light. After the in school workshop we had a trip to Wyld solar farm. We had a tour around the solar farm learning about how the solar panels work and had any of our questions answered by a solar technician. We then explored the biodiversity of the farm.

School Games Mark – Gold Award

We are delighted to announce that we have been awarded the School Games Mark Gold Award again this year. The purpose of the School Games Mark is to reward and recognise a school's engagement in the School Games against a national benchmark and to celebrate keeping people active. As a school we had to demonstrate that we maintained a series of outcomes including working towards 60 active minutes for every child (30 active mins within the school day), as well as afterschool provision, delivering and engaging in competition with purpose, creating positive experiences, a clear focus of transition, e.g. year 6 to secondary and improving experiences for young people and their families. This is a fantastic achievement and a result of hard work by our staff.

Attendance

In September, it is particularly important that your child attends school in the first few weeks as research shows that: 'If a child attends every day for the first few weeks of the school term that is a strong indicator that they will go on to attend school regularly throughout the term.

This shows just how important it is that children are at school, ready to learn in the first days and weeks of the Autumn. **A big thank you to the majority of parents who make sure their children attend school regularly!** Your efforts, working in partnership with the school, will ensure that your child will have the best chance to achieve their academic potential and have real opportunity in further education and the world of work. It will also enable your child to:

- access the lessons needed to achieve their expected grades
- maintain friendships and develop new ones
- have access to social and sporting events offered by the school
- explore potential life skills
- develop work habits such as good punctuality which are essential to thrive in the world of employment

Therefore, if you or your child are worried or has any concerns around attending school, we urge you to talk to us. The school has specialist staff who may be able to help, and all schools work closely with other educational partners who will also be able to help if needed. We are committed to supporting you so it is important you contact us as soon as you have concerns so we can work together to address any barriers to attendance. Alongside this newsletter, you will find information about the changes the Department for Education have made in relation to attendance for the year ahead and an update on penalty notices for unauthorised term time absences such as family holidays.
