Newsletter – 21st April 2023



Welcome back, it was lovely to see everyone after the Easter break. We have had a lovely Mass this Friday and again the children excelled themselves with their singing and readings. The gift Team delivered the last of Lent collection to the foodbank, who were so grateful for the support from St Mary's.

As I am sure, you are all aware the Government has had a drive this year in improving school attendance post Covid. As a school, we faced many challenges around sickness, especially at Christmas time. We know that due to these medical issues, children were not always able to be in school and as such, we have no children who have been in everyday this year. We therefore look at the best possible attendance, which is times when children could have been in school, and we are so pleased that so many of our families are working with us to ensure this is happening. I know that there has been a high level of anxiety around illness after Covid but I wish to reassure you that your children are cared for in school and if we are aware of any unwell children, we can do a variety of things to support them throughout the day. We are able to: administer paracetamol and other medicines to children if needed; limit time spent outside and provide indoor playtimes for your child and a friend; provide quieter activities or time during the day; have regular check-ins with them to see how things are going; contact yourselves to keep you updated or to collect your child if needed. As a school, we do need to improve our attendance so if there is anything that is a challenge for you please let us know as we can offer a range of support for our families.

One of the highlights of the week has been the children's first lesson on the balance bikes. They learnt how to pick up the bike safely from the left hand side, how to walk the bike by holding the handle bars, how to put their right leg over the back wheel to get on the bike and to sit and ride the balance bike. As well as this they also learnt how to get off the bike and put it safely on the floor. Also this week, they have had the weather we need to plant the potatoes. They have been planting lots of seeds in the garden, including beans, peas and flowers. They will continue their planting next week if the weather allows. On Friday, the children studied Dandelions with Mrs Slade. After observing the plants, the children drew them from observation. They named the parts of the plant and learnt the function of each part.

This week Woodpeckers have had a super return to school after the holidays. They have thoroughly enjoyed starting their new English book 'the day Louis got eaten'. They have also been curious about all of their new topics, especially when they went on a wild plant hunt in science around the school grounds.

Owl's have been fantastic this week; they really have all come back from Easter ready to learn. The children are showing great interest with their new learning. In History they have begun learning about significant individuals such as Christopher Columbus and Neil Armstrong. They have started their new science unit; they focussed on what makes a fair test this week so that they are ready to start exploring light.


