This week in Woodpeckers, a lovely time was had at Colyton Grammar School for the multiskills festival; all children had a go in the activities. They have also started writing their own stories based on 'Augustus and his smile'; the children are really enthusiastic about these and cannot wait to share them.

In Owl class, the children have begun writing their own chronological report, ask them what they have chosen to write about. Everyone has been working hard on their times tables in maths lessons and at home and they are seeing huge improvements. The children have shown their creative side in DT this week by making their next page for their pop-up book, where they have made a stained-glass window style picture.

This week Kestrels explored digital maps of Axminster to find out how old St Marys is. It was very exciting to discover that there has been a school at St Mary's since before 1890! They have improved and perfected their measuring skills in DT by weighing out the ingredients to make pastry. They rolled out the pastry, choosing a design for the lid of their apple pie, some choosing stripes others a circular lid with a shape cut out if the middle.

This week Eagles' class have enjoyed making their DT prototypes for a fairground ride. A prototype is a model of a product that is made before the finished product. It is a way of spotting any problems before using more expensive materials to make the real thing and allows a chance to see what the product will look like. They used cardboard, straws, split pins and masking tape to make the prototypes. It was great fun!
