It has been a busy week preparing for Christmas. I am going to miss the beautiful sound of the children practicing for their nativity, it has been so festive. As we move into the last week of the term, we continue to shake off coughs and colds and be increasingly mindful about doing our bit to stop the spread of the germs. Recent advice has advised schools to create airflows, clean regularly, wash hands and catch coughs and sneezes in tissues, which are all areas we identified and actioned a few weeks ago. It is getting colder now and we have the bags of salt ready if needed. Please remember to bring in thick coats, hats and gloves to keep warm during playtimes. Outdoor activity is an important part of the day but we do need to make sure children are dressed appropriately.

Robin Class this week have been doing lots of Christmas crafts. They have also been talking in class on how we prepare for Christmas and what our Christmas family traditions are. All the children in Robins really enjoyed the Lyme Regis band that visited this week.

This week in Woodpecker class it has been Nativity week! They have loved wearing their costumes, going on stage and performing to their grownups and to the rest of the school. All of the children aimed high and were super stars!

Owl class have had another busy week in the lead up to Christmas. As well as practising and performing our nativity along with Woodpecker Class, we have been finishing our unit of shapes in maths and we have begun writing our own poem in English. Owl class have enjoyed putting their pop-up books together in DT, the children will be able to bring these home next week to share with you.

Kestrel class have been exploring chemical changes in science this week. They have investigated what happens to different materials when they are burnt. Kestrels have been practicing their singing for the advent service next week as well as creating artwork for it.

In Eagles class this week we have been turning excerpts from Roald Dahl's book, 'Boy' into diary entries. We have also begun writing a biography about Roald Dahl. We really enjoyed watching the Ks1 nativity and the children have loved delivering cards from the post box to all of the other classes.

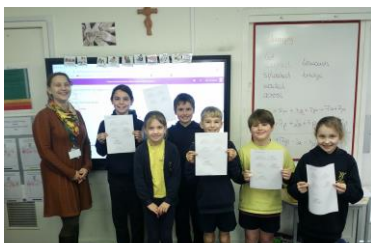

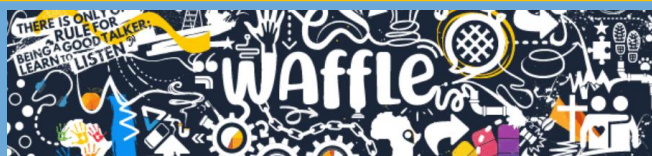
